A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE PARTNERSHIP

Partners of the Americas (POA) had its beginning as the person-to-person component of John F. Kennedy's ambitious initiative to improve relationships between the U.S. and Latin American countries called Alliance for Progress. Prominent figures in Maine, led by former Governor Kenneth M. Curtis, launched the Maine/Rio Grande do Norte (ME/RN) partnership in 1967. It is one of some 60 "partnerships" linking a state or region in the U.S. with an area in Latin America or the Caribbean. Geography (both northeastern states) and their marine environments were factors linking the two states.

Maine and Rio Grande do Norte have experienced a wide variety of cooperative projects involving people from all walks of life, professions and trades, as well as civic leaders and students. Governors' exchange visits, the Maritime Academy's ship's calls to the port of Natal, RN's capital city, and trade missions; all have played a part in creating a deep reservoir of good will, friendship and close relationships that exist among the citizens of both states.

Partners of the Americas is the largest voluntary organization in the Western Hemisphere engaged in international cooperation and training.

WHAT KIND OF PROJECTS DOES THE PARTNERSHIP ENGAGE IN?

Social and economic development encompasses a variety of activities. Over the years the Maine/Rio Grande do Norte partnership sponsored workshops, faculty and student exchanges, technical assistance, ecotours, cultural events and material assistance.

Examples include:

- Artist exchanges (such as painters and dancers).
- Expert exchanges and workshops on domestic violence issues.
- Cultural events such as "Brazil Night" galas, performing artists and Portuguese language immersion.
- Medical and dental equipment donations for poor rural communities.
- Seminar on creating business development centers.
- Faculty and student exchanges (ME and RN students in the 1970s are active members today).
- Consultation on natural resource protection.
- Introduction of new methods dealing with a dairy herd.
- As growth and development occur in communities, projects change focus accordingly.

HOW ARE PROJECTS SELECTED?

Projects are cooperative enterprises. They are created from plans jointly developed with our sister state. Members from both sides use their knowledge and skills to share information, develop new tools, train for new skills and strengthen institutions to improve the lives of people. Projects are reciprocal in nature, transferring resources from north to south and south to north.
